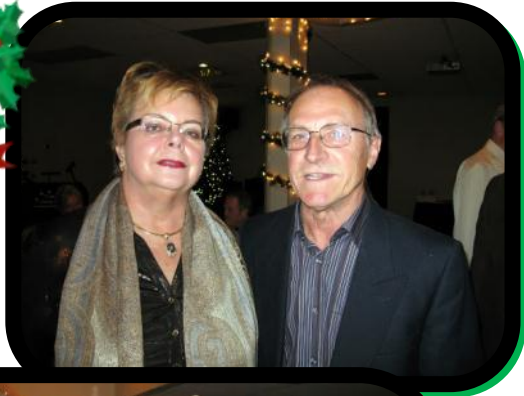

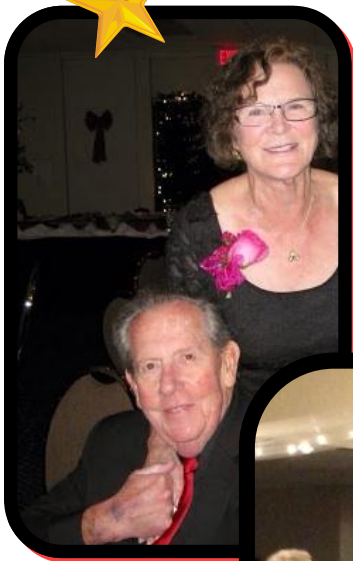

GOVERNMENT & INDUSTRY LIAISON

The following report was submitted by P/D/C Jerry Powers, SN to District Commander Shirley Shea and members of the Council for the Pacific Mainland District. The report was received February 3, 2014.



PACIFIC MAINLAND DISTRICT A UNIT OF CANADIAN POWER & SAIL SQUADRONS

Coast Guard Canada (CCG) Update:

Salvage operation involving the sunken US supply ship, General M.G. Zalinski, was completed in December 2013 and declared a success. Monitoring of the ship will be ongoing and a final check of the vessel will be done in the spring of 2014. The ship went down near Hartley Bay in 1946.

Fraser River boaters should be aware that both the upstream and the downstream range markers on Woodward Island in the south arm of the Fraser River (west of Massey Tunnel) are being reconstructed this month. Minor shifts in position of the markers may take place and such data will be published once resurvey and recertification has been carried out.

Replacement or relocation of the Cape Mudge Sector light is still under consideration. CCG has expressed preference for a new location instead of extensive tree clearing on First Nations land; however, funding continues to be an issue.

Western Canada Marine Response Corporation (WCMRC) Update:

WCMRC has recently announced their intent to hire 16 new employees in 2014 as part of their coastal expansion and re-organization plan. They have also placed an order for another rapid response self-skimming vessel similar to the MJ Green and Eagle Bay, both 50 feet in length.

WCMRC continues to work closely with both Kinder Morgan and Northern Gateway Pipeline (NGP) on their proposals. If either or both of these projects move forward, there are further WCMRC expansion plans in place and ready for implementation.

Transportation Safety Board of Canada (TSB):

The TSB publishes some very interesting reports of maritime incidents which may be of interest to pleasure boaters. Members can access it at www.bst-tsb.gc.ca. Of particular interest is a recently released report (M12F0011) of a collision involving two fishing vessels off the coast of Washington. The report comments on a number of factors that ultimately resulted in the collision, the sinking of one of the vessels and the loss of one crew member.

It's Time for Spring Cleaning



As we begin to spring-clean our houses, we also need to consider what cleaning and preparations should be done to ensure our boats are ready for the summer cruising season. Whether you are new to boating or need a refresher course on preparing for the cruising season, check out the following articles for tips on getting you and your boat ready:

IT'S MAINTENANCE TIME AGAIN

It's that special time of year when you are starting to get enthusiastic about boating but it's too cold to go out on the water. This makes it the ideal time for maintenance. You don't really want to go out yet but you want to spend time on the boat. So make the best of this time and get your boat ready for summer.

Make a list, check it twice. You didn't get around to it at Christmas, so do it now. The best list to use for maintenance tasks is the one you make yourself for your boat. You can start from one of the thousands of suggested lists on the internet but your boat will be different in some irritatingly unique way. And remember, your list is never finished. It's an ongoing project. Add to it whenever something unexpected happens that you need to keep checking, or when you get tips from other boat owners about strange behaviours of your model that aren't mentioned in the manual. Keep a maintenance log that shows all work done on the boat by you or by others. Here are some items to get you started. This is by no means complete for any specific boat.

1) Engine

- Change engine oil
- Change transmission oil
- Change Filters Oil, Fuel, Water separator
- Change coolant as required
- Check water pump, change impeller as required
- Inspect all engine belts
- Check for rust in engine compartment
- May indicate coolant leak
- Check for oil and fuel leaks, repair as required
- Check for soot (may indicate exhaust leak)
- Keep engine pan clean so new leaks can be detected
- Check for excessive vibration. May indicate engine and/or shaft misalignment
- Inspect hoses and hose clamps
- Clean sea strainer

2) Electrical

- Check battery fluid levels
- Clean posts and clamps, tighten if

necessary

- Check connections to starter and alternator
- Ensure contacts to shore power connector are not corroded or burnt, connector should never feel hot
- Check that all lights are operational

3) Safety Items

- Inspect lifelines
- Check operation of engine compartment fan
- Inspect fire extinguishers, re-certify as required
- Check expiry dates on flares
- Check condition of PFDs, horn, flashlights
- Check and restock first aid kit
- Verify operation of smoke and CO detectors

4) Plumbing

- Check operation of sump pump
- Inspect hoses and hose clamps
- Check head operation
- Inspect rest of sanitation system for leaks

5) Lubrication

- Blocks, sheaves, winches
- Wheel and linkage to rudder
- Other mechanical parts as required

6) Spares

- Ensure that spares are on hand to replace impellers, filters, belts and other items recommended for your boat

7) Miscellaneous

- Check through hulls
- Inspect anchor rode, line and chain
- Replace zincs, in engine, propeller shaft, outboard, etc.
- Check stuffing box
- For sailboats, check condition of lines, sails and rigging
- Lubricate furler bearings

GET READY FOR SUMMER CRUISING

There is some snow on the ground but the first day of spring is approaching – March 21, and spring heralds the start of the White Rock Squadrons active cruising program. Elsewhere in this Anchorline edition you will find cruising dates, marinas and associated information

As Cruisemaster, I and the Squadron look forward to seeing you out on the water. New boaters are especially welcomed and encouraged to attend. We are all scattered about different marinas but if you have never crossed the Strait please give me a call and we will try to

find you a buddy boat. So what you do to prepare for a wonderful weekend with other Squadron members.

Firstly, let's talk about your boat. By now you had it out of the water – legs serviced, bottom paint applied or touched up, zincs replaced – don't forget about checking or replacing bellows or impellers if you have them. Always carry radiator coolant, belts, hoses, spark plugs, fuel filters, oil filters, oil and a tool kit. Make sure your batteries are in good shape and don't forget the power cord. Lastly leave your marina with a full tank of fuel.

As for yourselves pack a bag of casual clothing.....we don't stand on formalities. There is a happy hour the first day-- bring an appetizer and don't forget your favourite adult beverage. A potluck supper generally on the Sunday is followed by a crib tournament.

Please let the Cruisemaster know you will be attending. Stay safe and we will see you at Port Browning for the Easter cruise April 18 and 19.

THE IMPORTANCE OF A CHECKLIST

While this is not all inclusive, it is a supplement. Our old Boating Course C-2.2.2 has a detailed list, and there are lists available on-line too. A check list is essential so that nothing is missed.

Check the integrity of through-hulls. Operate the shut off valves until they open and close freely. Check all hoses and clamps. Ensure through-hulls are open prior to drawing water through them. If you have winterized any fresh water system, flush out all (non-toxic) antifreeze.

Check the engine antifreeze to ensure proper strength. This may have been replaced as part of the lay-up procedure! Is the anti-corrosive chemical still active?

A proper tune-up of the engines should be done. A fresh set of spark plugs is "cheap" insurance to help ensure a smooth running engine.

Gasoline: unless you have added stabilizer to the gasoline, it will be stale.

Therefore, drain and replace. You may have to overhaul the carburetor/fuel injectors, since varnish may have separated from the fuel and coated delicate internal parts.

Diesel: unless you have added biocide, it may have to be replaced, and possibly have to fuel tanks flushed.

How is the battery? Fully charged? Fluid levels? Unless it has been kept charged during layover, it will most likely need replacing.

Thoroughly clean the boat, inside and out. Waxing will help long term preservation and appearance of the Gel-Coat.

Inspect and paint as needed. If you use ablative bottom paint then repaint when temperature is OK.

Inspect anchor rode. Is it undamaged and available (bitter end fastened?)

Inspect sails, sheets, halyards, rigging, rudder. (check for corrosion inside stain-

less steel fittings).

Safety Equipment. Inspect all items, ensure that all required is on board. Lost your check list? Transport Canada shows requirements for your boat size, on-line.

Fire extinguishers, inspect and renew as necessary. The inspection card needs signing.

Flares, how many? Up to date? (only valid for four years from date of manufacture).

Spares kit and tools, spare oil, on board and available.

Check your boating equipment, (lines, fenders, boat hook, in good shape and available).

Before you launch, ensure that the DRAIN PLUG is properly installed too.

THE GALLEY GOURMET



Don't have an oven on your boat? Need some new ideas for dinner while you are out on the water? Check out these great recipes provided by Ann of Drifter.

Penne with Vodka Sauce

Serves 6

1 T butter
 2 medium shallots; minced (about ½ cup)
 2 garlic cloves; minced
 2 T fresh parsley; minced (less if using dried)
 2/3 t salt
 ¼ t pepper
 3 T tomato paste
 2 oz Vodka
 12 oz penne
 ½ C whipping cream
 Fresh basil cut in ribbons for garnish

Heat large skillet over medium-low heat. Add butter, shallots & garlic. Sauté until shallots start to caramelize, about 3 to 5 minutes. Add parsley, salt & pepper, stirring once or twice. Add tomato paste and mix to form paste. Cook for about 5 minutes, moving paste around pan occasionally; add vodka. Scrap bottom of pan with a wooden spoon and cook for about 5 minutes more. Add whipping cream and simmer. Add cooked pasta to sauce. Stir, serve and top with basil.

Stove Top One-Dish Chicken Skillet

Makes 4 servings.

1 ½ C hot water
 ¼ C butter or margarine, melted
 1 pkg. Stove Top Stuffing Mix for Chicken
 4 small boneless/skinless chicken breasts (1lb)
 1 can condensed Cream of Mushroom soup
 1/3 C sour cream

Mix hot water, margarine & stuffing; set aside.
 Cook chicken in skillet on medium heat 5 minutes. on each side.
 Mix soup & sour cream; pour over chicken. Top with stuffing; cover. Cook on low heat 10 minutes. or until chicken is done.

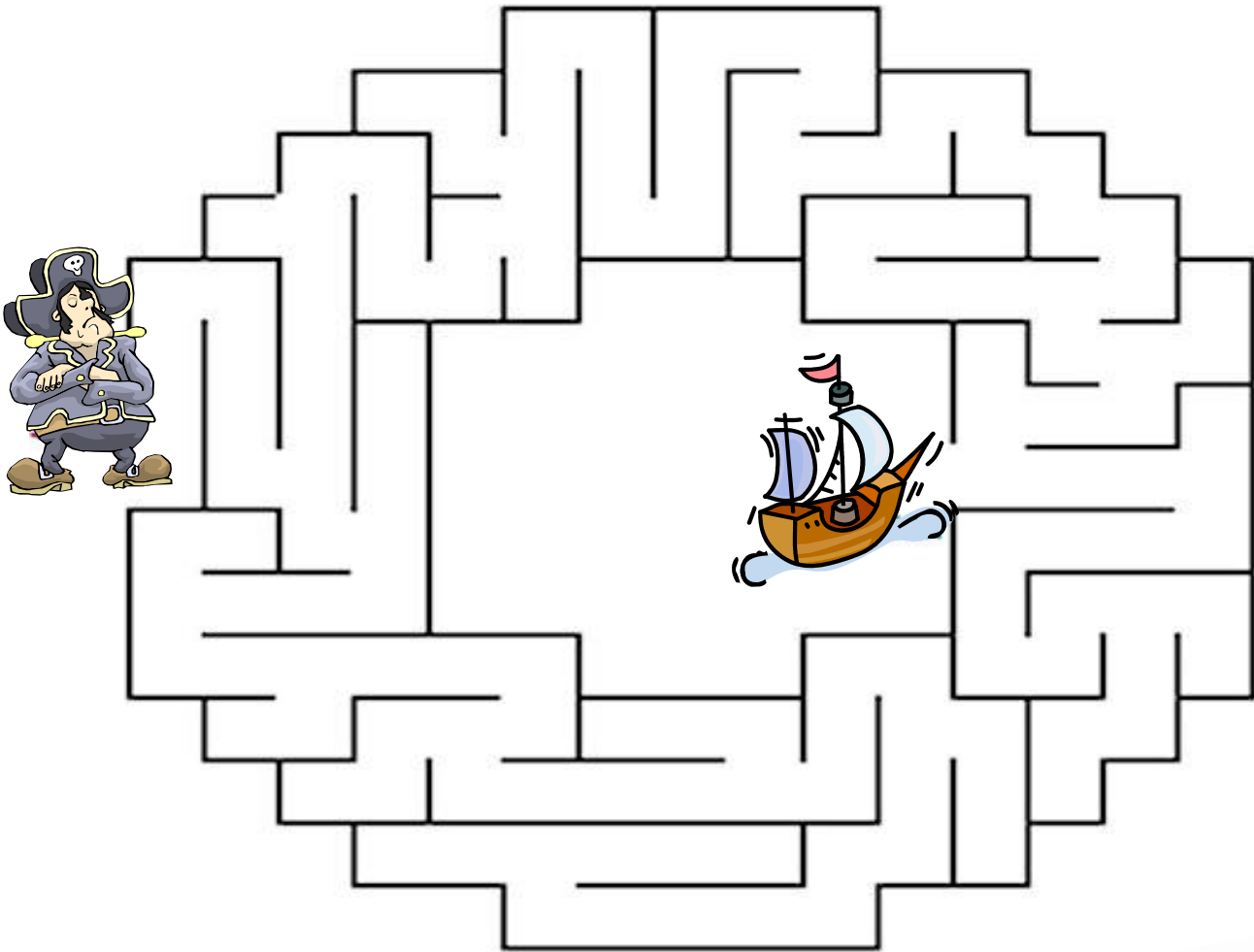
