

Why Celestial Navigation?

I'm hooked. To me, celestial navigation represents the romance and the adventure of the long-gone days of the sailing ships, when much of our world had yet to be explored.

The purpose of celestial navigation, of course, is to solve the age-old problems of knowing one's position and setting a course on the high seas without reference to landmarks. These days, such problems are better solved using satellite navigation technology with an accuracy of a just a few metres, in day or night and in any weather. So why bother with a cumbersome methodology that can only be used when the right parts of the horizon and the sky are clear, and is most useful only during twilight? The answer to that question now needs to be quite a personal one. For me it is an another connection to our sea-going history and an opportunity to carry on some of the art and science of it. Today, celestial navigation can be a satisfying intellectual pursuit that is an end in itself. The study of it will surely make one a better navigator, wherever the voyage.

THE GALLEY GOURMET



Experience and Enjoy Crabbing

Part of the experience of boating in the Pacific Northwest is capitalizing upon the resources of nature. Catching crabs and enjoying the recipes that flourish with fresh caught crab are within the experience and abilities of even the novice boater. As in anything knowledge is paramount.

Of most importance, a shellfish license is obligatory, both in US waters and Canadian waters. The rules are slightly different in each country. The US mandate larger size for keeping, and also require that the mantle is kept on board as long as the crab meat is on board (for inspection if boarded). When your license is purchased, get the rules to clarify your actions.

Traps...all crab traps seem to work well.


Bait....the better the bait, the bigger the crabs you may catch. Best are salmon parts; chicken parts also work well.

Depth...15 to 50 feet.

Bottom...sandy, muddy, eel grass.

Cooking: some like to cook whole (with all the essence)...some break the crab in half, discard the mantle (more amenable to a smaller pot...it's your choice).

Harvesting the crab meat after cooking is best done with your crew and a glass of wine as part of happy hour!

Let's eat!

Baked Crab and Artichoke Dip:

6–8 oz. crabmeat

- 1-6 oz. jar artichoke hearts, drained well and chopped
- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 cup Parmesan cheese, grated
- 2 garlic cloves, minced

1/4 tsp. Tabasco sauce

Salt and pepper to taste

Combine all ingredients in a small baking dish and bake at 350 for 20

- 25 min. until hot and bubbly.

Serve hot with tortilla chips or crusty French bread.


